<p>The horticulturally innovative Living 'Bee-hive' is a permanent living-art installation. It takes the form of a grassed and planted dome 16m in diameter by 6.5m high, and is made of a steel skeleton clad in living plant material, transparent panels and open spaces. Visitors can also see the newly expanded Permaculture Gardens, an organic food garden, demonstrating just what is possible in an urban environment.
